Announcements

The officials' advancement grid has been updated to reflect recently approved changes. Here are a summary of changes made this year and reflected in the chart:

- the minimum age for judges and scorers has been removed at all levels
- appointed and chief officials must still be 18+
- chiefing requirements have been replaced with ACJ requirements for advancement to senior ratings. This allows for qualified minors to advance through the process.

Jim Babcock

The Midwest Region is proud to recognize the incredible contributions of James "Jim" Babcock, nominated for the AWSA Midwest Hall of Fame in the Official category.

A lifelong skier since 1954 and AWSA member since 1972, Jim is best known for his unwavering dedication to tournament safety and officiating. Over the past five decades, he has served as a

National Safety Director, Instructor, Trainer, Judge, Scorer, and Driver, working at every level of the sport — from state tournaments to world championships across AWSA, NSSA, Adaptive, Wakeboard, and Collegiate events.

Jim's leadership has shaped the sport in Wisconsin and throughout the Midwest. He's a two-term President of the Wisconsin Water Ski Federation, served 33 years as Midwest Council Representative, chaired safety committees at the state, regional, and national levels, and even produced the Midwest Regional Guide for 20+ years.

Along the way, his outstanding service has been honored with the Wisconsin Water Ski Hall of Fame (2017), Robert L. King Award (2014 Nationals), and numerous accolades for officiating excellence.

A humble "worker bee," Jim has spent decades training future safety directors — teaching 100+ clinics in 17 states — and quietly shaping the safety standards that keep our sport progressing. His nomination celebrates a career built on passion, commitment, and tireless volunteerism — a true icon in Midwest water skiing!



Greg Chapman

The Midwest Region proudly recognizes Greg Chapman, nominated for the AWSA Midwest Hall of Fame in the Official category.

A dedicated member of the Ohio Water Ski Association since the late 1980s, Greg has spent more than 20 years serving the sport as a Senior Driver, bringing his MasterCraft boat to nearly every tournament and being a cornerstone of events across the region. From his early days learning to slalom at Rainbow Lake to sharing the sport with his son Mark — who inspired his deeper

involvement — Greg has driven at every level of competition. His impressive résumé includes:

- 30+ Ohio State Championships
- 18 Midwest Regionals (Chief Driver in 2004)
- 9 AWSA Nationals (Chief Driver in 2008)
- Pan Am Championships (only Midwest Pan Am-rated driver)
- Numerous Pro, Jr. Worlds, Jr. U.S. Opens, and international tournaments

While he jokes his lone first-place finish was back in 1982 as a skier, Greg has helped set countless state, regional, national, and international records from behind the wheel — embodying the idea that "the skier doesn't get the record if the driver doesn't drive a record-capable performance."

Known not only for his skill but for being a kind, selfless, first-class human being, Greg Chapman's nomination honors decades of service, passion, and leadership in Midwest water skiing.

Team USA Strikes Gold at U21 Worlds

Calgary, Canada — Team USA delivered a powerhouse performance at the 2025 IWWF Under 21 World Waterski Championships, capturing the overall team gold medal! With poise under pressure and big scores when it mattered, the American squad rose above fierce competition from rivals Austria, Australia, France, and Canada — thanks in part to team member Ty Kosek from the Midwest!

The Midwest was proud to have four representatives in Canada this year! Ty Kosek competed in all three events as a member of Team USA, with his scores contributing to the team's overall points. Jaret Zoellner joined as a Wildcard Member and competed in the jump event. Supporting the athletes, Christy Kingsmill served as Team Manager, and Erin Kalkbrenner took on the role of Team Coach.

We even had Midwest representation on the officials panel! Dan Van Dyke and Jeff Smith both were appointed judges for the event.

Junior Skier Spotlight - Luke Owens

2025 has been a RECORD SETTING year for B1 skier Luke Owens. In June Luke set a new Midwest Tournament Record for B1 Slalom with 2@32 off @30.4MPH at Kim's Classic in Clio, MI. Just two weeks later in July he set a new Midwest Skier Record with 1@32 off at the Pleasant Shores Record in Van Wert, OH. One week later he broke his own Michigan State Record and set the new bar at 3@32 off in the State tournament. But he was not done yet. In Maize, KS at Mystic Lakes he

set a new Midwest Regional Tournament record of 5@32' off, which was previously 2.5@32' off set by Nate Smith in 2000 and tied by Bode Bulfer in 2021. Luke has won Midwest Regionals B1 Slalom 3 consecutive years. He tricks decently too as he has won Midwest Regionals two years in a row. In addition to waterskiing, Luke loves tubing, playing football, and basketball at home in Michigan. Luke is an excellent student and takes year around piano lessons and full immersion Spanish classes.
